TOKYO, Aug. 28 (AP)-The United States Air Force said lonight that giant B-36 bombers flown to Japan this week under warlike secrecy, are teaming with other warplanes in a "realistic combate type" Far East exercise within 700 miles of Vladis. vostok, a Russian stronge hold base.

A mass flight of B 36's, ca-pable of carrying atomic bombs anywhere in the world, landed near Tokvo Tuesday after a trail-blazing flight across the Pacific


