In N. Y., Agrees to Return

NEW YORK—Mildred McDonald, a petite blue-eyed brownette, wilted under seven hours of questioning today and confessed the pistol slaying of her ex-sweetheart's sister in Somerville, Monday.

THE SOBERING SOMERVILLE STENOGRAPHER, picked up by police here last night, said she pulled a gun on 14-year-old Mary DiRocco because she thought the girl was taunting her about a broken romance.

"I became panicky and nervous and I shot her," Miss McDonald said. "I guess I kept on shooting—I don't remember how many times."

LATER TODAY, AFTER APPEARING at two court sessions and a police lineup, Miss McDonald tearfully agreed to return to Massachusetts without a legal battle. She waived jurisdiction, and was turned over to Massachusetts authorities.

The trip back was delayed, however. The detectives sent out word they would need a matron to travel with them and the girl prisoner.

MARY KIRKPATRICK, state policewoman, was sent to New York to serve as matron on the trip to Boston tonight.

The prisoner will be flown here on an airliner leaving New York at 9 P.M. She will be booked at Somerville headquarters and arraigned tomorrow in Somerville court on the murder charge.

THE 25-YEAR-OLD SUSPECT at first denied the killing to New York police who questioned her from 9 P.M. to 1 A.M. Then Massachusetts State Police Lt. David Murphy and Somerville Detective Robert Brady arrived.

Some hours later, after a stay in the women's detention pen, Miss McDonald was near collapse as she faced the ordeal of an appearance before the police lineup.




Hub Food Costs up 3.4 P. C. Since April

The price of food consumed at home jumped 3.4 per cent. in Boston between April and July, the U. S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today.

Food was the major factor in the 1.3 per cent. increases in the general cost-of-living index.

Clothing prices declined, with women's cotton dresses and shoes registering the biggest cuts.

Fruits and vegetables, up 7.8 per cent. in the three month period, added most to family budgets. Meat, poultry and fish went up 5.6 per cent., while dairy products remained unchanged.
